








Nancy sings praises to the Lord as she gets ready for work . . . she hasn't even seen Sally yet.

Wait a minute, I shouldn't be thinking these things... I'll think about the Lord instead. Let's see... "The Lord is my Shepherd..."






By the time Nancy meets Sally she's so angry she isn't even civil to her.






In this case Nancy herself tries to stop the flow of negative thoughts about Sally, thinking that the thoughts were her own. In doing this she is, in essence, resisting Satan in her own strength. She will always lose the battle because we humans are not, and never will be, stronger than Satan.
